

Pacific Northwest PETS 2012

Educational Sessions

The PNWPETS schedule combines large and small-group educational sessions, each focused on a specific topic designed to help presidents elects in leading their clubs. PEs will participate in a series of sessions with both required and elective topics during the three days of PETS. In the highly-interactive small group sessions, PEs will join others from similar-sized clubs to hear new Rotary information and best practices, share ideas and discuss common issues and solutions. PEs are also offered the choice of optional pre-sessions prior to the official start of PNWPETS, including a number of specialized topics. A team of highly-experienced instructors from throughout the nine districts will lead the PNWPETS small group educational sessions.

- Rotary 101 – a session on Rotary basics designed for PEs who have been Rotarians for four years or less and PEs of any tenure who would like a refresher

- Second-Time Club Presidents – a session for those who have previously served as a club president
- Revitalizing Your Club – a session especially designed for PEs who recognize the need to re-energize or make changes to re-motivate their clubs

- Planning and Goal Setting: Setting Your Club on the Right Track
